## Korea 1 or 2 ?

**N Korea rejects proposal to form unified judo team**

SEOUL, July 10 (Kyodo) -- North Korea has rejected a proposal to form a unified Korean judo team for the World Cup team competition in September, the International Judo Federation (IJF) said.

The rejection of a unified squad competing in Minsk was delivered to the IJF in a letter May 25.

"South Korea should change its hostile policies against North Korea to friendly ones if such a unified Korean team is to be formed in accordance with the spirit of the Olympics and to contribute to world peace," North Korean Judo Association chief Choe Soo Il said in the letter. Choe also said, political and military confrontations between the two countries should be done away as these have been the basic problem.

In another letter dated June 30, North Korea notified the IJF that its women judoka, who have already qualified to compete in the World Cup, would not participate because of "internal problems."

In May, ITJ executive board members unanimously approved the South Korean request that North and South Korea form a unified squad at the World Cup.

North Korea is known for producing world-class judoka in the women's lightweight classes -- most notably Kye Sun Hi who defeated Japan's heavily favoured Ryoko Tamura in the 48-kilogram final at the Atlanta Olympics in 1996.
