# Financial Reporting - EOFY 2019

The financial statements for EOFY 2019 were audited and had been issued with an unqualified opinion by our external auditor.

## Income YTD 2019

EOFY 2019 finished with YTD surplus of \$121K above forecast of \$109K by 10.2%

The expected results reflected downscaling of provisions to meet liabilities in Strategic Planning & Development and Publicity & Promotion.

## **Financial Position**

Surplus before depreciation of \$136,286 indicated strong cash flow and financial stability.

## Cash Flow 2019

JVI cash flow remained healthy. Key Performance Indicators (see attachments) indicated healthy financial strength and liquidity to maintain unforseen increases in operating expenses or decline in income.

The organisation has no borrowings.

# Expenditure YTD 2019

In January, JVI held a 5-day technical workshop conducted by ex-Olympian & 3 x World Champion Jeon Ki-Young . Outgoings for this workshop were \$13K.

JVI's computer systems, competition entries, scorings, and statistics are currently an on-going upgrade process (\$8.8K) undertaken by the Registrar.

JVI continues to recognise on-going pressure to increase revenue by attracting memberships and \$8K were expended on back patches and advertising during the period.

Also for the same period, JVI continues to pay out-of-pocket GST (\$8.7K) for its members as membership fees are GST exclusive.

Expenditure of \$5.6K was made in relation to referee's remunerations and \$1.6K on gift vouchers given to volunteers for their contributions during the year

In Low Value Assets (LVA), a total of \$11.8K was spent on acquiring a Podium (\$4.6K) and repair of four trolleys (\$7.2K). The trolleys were extensively overhauled to carry heavy loads.

Provisions of \$10K are in place to meet co-investment between Judo Australia and JVI for State Performance Hub scheduled later in the year. The proposal is to provide a pathway

within Victoria for elite and up and coming players.

A grant of \$6K (Athlete Pathway) from SRV assisted in defraying expenses of the State team participating in National Titles 2019 at Gold Coast. Without this grant, a small

surplus of \$433 would have incurred.

## **Future Planning**

Financial assistance is in place to elite and emerging athletes in helping with travels and girl's coaching programs to encourage participations "Women Only" class conducted by

female instructors. This is in line with Strategic Planning of Judo Victoria.

As with Strategic Planning is the appointment of part time Admininstration Officer in September to assist in the duties of the Secretary and Registrar.

There has been no significant change which may impact in the nature of the activities of the organisation. Despite our financial progress, we must remain diligent, thoughtful and innovative.

In closing, JVI would like to thank all the volunteers for their hard work and support in 2018 -19.

## Independent Auditor's Report for Judo Victoria Inc

## To the members of Judo Victoria Inc

We have audited the accompanying financial report of Judo Victoria Inc, which comprises the statement of financial position as at 30 June 2019, the statement of comprehensive income for the year then ended, statement of changes in equity/statement of recognised income and expenses and cash flow statement for the year then ended, notes comprising a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information and the Committee Members assertion statement.

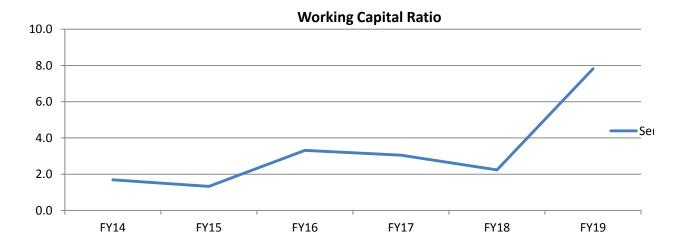

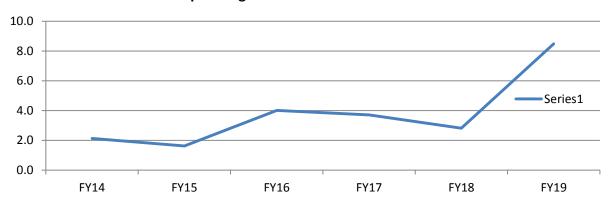

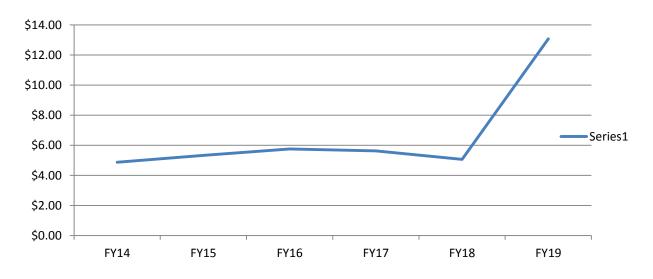

Judo Victoria Nomination for Life Membership

I would like to nominate Daniel Kelly for Life Membership of Judo Victoria.

Daniel has served JVI in many ways over more than **thirty years**. In his youth he was of course one of the best competitive judoka that Australia has ever produced. He qualified for and represented Australia in **4 Olympics**, something that no other person has done (not even Maria Pekli). This alone really should qualify him for Life Membership, particularly when one reflects on some of the marvellous judoka who have since represented Australia at the Olympic level, once, perhaps twice, then faded away never to be seen again.

Daniel has not faded away. As well as leading by example, Daniel has energetically contributed to the growth of Victorian judo, not just as a Club Coach, but as a **State Coach**. Much of Victoria's elite level success over the last fifteen years can be attributed to the influence of Daniel's coaching and leadership.

Daniel has not only led on the mat, he has also been a strong leader off the mat as well. He has selflessly given his time (as do all Committee members) to the JVI Committee, serving in various roles such as Committee Member and Vice-President, until he has ended up where he is now, carrying the flag for Victoria as State President.

Judo Victoria has had many fine athletes over the years. It has had many fine coaches over the years. There have also been many fine and dedicated administrators (such as yourself Rod!!).

However I can't think of many people who have combined all three together to such a high standard.

Two other points I would make in nominating Daniel for Life Membership. Daniel is a strong personality, in fact he is larger than life. You can see the effect that he has on others whenever he steps on the mat or into a meeting room. His presence is immediately felt as soon as he enters the room. In spite of this however, he is not a divisive person. Daniel has the knack of being able to have robust conversation with people, without causing offence. If he doesn't agree with someone, he will say it straight up. The overall effect of this trait has been to unify Judo Victoria, not fracture it, as has happened in the past and as often happens in other martial arts. Daniel has demonstrated the ability to put aside personal differences and debate issues on their merits alone. I believe this is a character trait that should not be underestimated in considering Daniel's contribution to Victorian Judo.

The second point is one that I raise reluctantly. Daniel has made enormous contributions to both Victorian and Australian judo, all the while carrying the worries and cares of looking after his eldest son Erik. Daniel, together with Maria, shows so much courage on a daily basis that people often forget the weight of their parental burden. I am not proposing that Daniel should be awarded Life Membership because he has a son who needs much more care than most parents are asked to give. I am pointing out that, given the amount of extra care Erik needs, it is doubly amazing Daniel has achieved so much and given JVI so much time.

I believe that Daniel Kelly is eligible three times over to be considered for Life Membership and it is my pleasure to nominate him for Life Membership.
